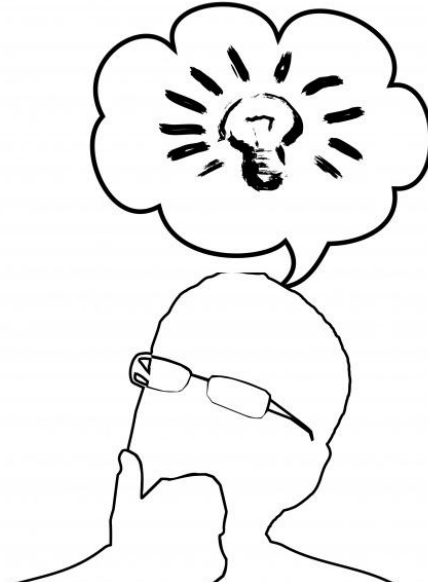

SADDLEBACK HIGH SCHOOL Roadrunner Nation Student Cell Phone Policy



Cell phones are to be put away during class hours, including time out of the classroom on a hall pass, and during ALL school and state testing. Students will not be allowed to use cell phones during class time. School authorities may confiscate cell phones at any time for failure to follow school policy. Parents and students will sign understanding of the cell phone policy annually.

Students will place their cell phones and earbuds (including Airbuds and Ipods) in **Teacher Designated Storage Area** upon entering classroom.

Consequences for misuse:

Step One: **Verbal Warning**

Student will place cell phone in Teacher Designated Storage Area

Step Two: Cell phone is **confiscated** from student

Student will pick up from **Teacher** at the **End of the Day**
Teacher will call Parent

Step Three: Cell phone is **confiscated** from student

Teacher will give cell phone to Student Relations Office
Student will **pick up** phone from **Administrator**

Step Four: Cell phone is **confiscated** from student

Teacher will give cell phone to Student Relations Office
Parent will **pick up** phone from **Administrator**

Step Five:

Cell phone is **confiscated** from student
Teacher will give cell phone to Student Relations Office
Teacher will complete an Office Discipline Referral

Dress Code - What's acceptable & What's not?

Hats / Caps/Beanies

- Only **Saddleback hats** are allowed on campus
- Can only be worn outdoor (not in buildings or classrooms)

No **Hoodies** worn over head except when weather permits (outdoors)

Violation of school dress code can lead to consequences, including parent conference, issuing of spirit wear, detention, campus beautification, Saturday School, or other consequences issued by admin.

Plain t-shirts

- No plain colored t-shirts allowed
- Shirts must have design/logo/collar

Students who violate dress code will be asked to change/cover or their parent will be called to bring a new shirt.
